Regional Club Challenge

In 2004, the German Shepherd Club of Atlanta made some noise with its strong entry in the Regional Club Challenge, and took **second place!** Congratulations to everyone who made this great showing possible.

By way of review, the mission of the Challenge is to recognize and foster competition among the GSDCA Regional clubs as well as the sharing of ideas and resources. In addition, the GSDCA Regional Club Challenge is meant to promote camaraderie among the individual members with the regional clubs associated with the GSDCA by encouraging competition with other clubs.

The Challenge competition runs from September 1 through August 31 of each year. This timeframe allows time for points to be compiled prior to the National. Regional clubs may receive credit for events or titles earned during that time.

Awards will be presented at the National to the "Best Regional Club of

the Year" according to the size of the club. The GSDC of Atlanta fits into the, 61+ member category — the largest category.

How Points Are Awarded

GSDCA Regional Club Challenge points will be awarded for titles that were earned in the United States. All AKC, GSDCA-WDA Performance Sports that result in titles being awarded will also be awarded Regional Club Challenge points.

Point categories are broken down in performance and conformation with many subcategories in each section. You can find the specific breakdowns of titles and point values on the Club website.

Individuals are responsible for submitting their own points (the forms will be on the website). Kim McNamara will submit Club information for consideration.

Let's get everything ready for the 2005 Challenge and win first place!•



Junior Showmanship

The Junior must obtain a Junior Number (this is very important, and we recommend taking care of this now instead of waiting so everything is in order come show time).

As we prepare for our upcoming show, the GSDCA of Atlanta is pleased to announce we are offering Junior Showmanship at our trial. We thought we would take this opportunity to refresh you on the rules so our Juniors can show right along with all of us "seniors." You can find the complete rules for Junior Showmanship at www.akc.org/rules/juniors.

According to the AKC website, "Participation in Junior Showmanship is intended to encourage Juniors to learn how to care

for and present different breeds. Part of the educational process could include apprenticeship or assisting professional handlers. Junior may take their employers' dogs into the ring while still retaining amateur status."

Any Junior up to the age of 18 is eligible to compete as a Junior in Performance Events. The Junior must obtain a Junior Number (this is very important, and we recommend taking care of this now instead of waiting so everything is in order come show time). The

dog must be owned by the Junior Handler or the Junior Handler's father, mother, brother, sister, uncle, aunt, grandfather, or grandmother, including corresponding step and half relations, or by a member of the Junior Handler's household.

The AKC will acknowledge any Junior who successfully completes a title. The Junior must have been the handler of record for all qualifying scores leading to the title. All qualifying scores and titles must have been completed after January 1, 1999. Good luck Juniors!•

Summer Safety Tips

Summer is here. For many of us that means more time outside with our pooches. The following tips have been adapted from the AKC website. Keep them in mind for a healthy and safe summer.

Beware of insect bites. If your dog is bitten or stung, remove the stinger and watch the site for an allergic reaction. If a reaction occurs or there have been multiple wasp, bee or mosquito bites, take the animal to the vet.

Talk with your veterinarian about flea and tick prevention medications.

Heartworm is a common problem for dogs. Take your dog to a vet for a heartworm check every spring and follow your vet's advice for heartworm precautions.

Make sure that plants and fertilizers

within the dog's reach are not toxic.

The outdoors exposes dogs to the elements. Dogs may need extra brushing and bathing to stay clean and healthy.

No matter how careful and responsible you may be, accidents can happen. Make sure your vet's phone number is close at hand and available to all family members.

General Summer Safety Concerns

Hot weather can make anyone feel uncomfortable, and your dog is no exception. Here are some safety concerns for responsible dog owners:

Never leave your dog unattended in direct sunlight. Heatstroke can occur and lead to brain damage or death. Signs of heatstroke are panting, drooling, rapid pulse and fever. Immediately immerse the

dog in cool water and seek emergency veterinary assistance.

Never leave your dog unattended in a hot, parked car. When it's only 80 degrees outside, the inside of a car can heat up to more than 120 degrees in just minutes. Leaving the windows partially rolled down will not help.

Always make sure your dog has fresh water.

All dogs should have proper identification at all times. The AKC suggests a collar with an ID tag, along with a tattoo or a microchip.

Keep your dog on a leash when he is outdoors to prevent accidents and injuries.

Try to avoid strenuous exercise with your dog on extremely hot days and refrain from physical activity when the sun's heat is most intense.

Does Your Doggie Paddle?

The majority of dogs can swim and they love it. But dogs entering the water for

the first time should be tested. Here are some important tips for teaching your dog how to swim:

Never throw your dog into the water.

Start in shallow water, and call your dog's name. You can also try to coax him in with a treat or toy - but always keep him close.

Another way to introduce your dog to the water is with a dog that already swims and is friendly with your dog. Let your dog follow his friend.

If your dog begins to Doggie-paddle with his front legs only, lift his hind legs and help him float. He'll quickly catch on and will then keep his back end up.

Swimming is a great form of exercise, but don't let your dog overdo it. He will be using new muscles and may tire quickly.

Be careful of strong currents or tides that are hazardous for even the best swimmers.

Never leave your dog unattended. You should always be in a position to

help him out of the water.

Beach Tips

While we live far from the ocean, if a trip to the coast is a part of your summer plans, there are certain precautions you should take:

Dogs can sunburn. Limit your dog's exposure when the sun is unusually strong, and apply sunblock to his ears and nose 30 minutes before going outside.

Watch the water - dogs are easy targets for jellyfish.

If your dog is out of shape, don't encourage him to run on the sand. Running on a beach is strenuous exercise, and a dog that is out of shape can easily pull a tendon or ligament.

Cool ocean water is tempting to your dog. Do not allow him to drink too much seawater. The salt in the water will make him sick.

Salt and other minerals found in the ocean can damage your dog's coat. So, when you are ready to leave for the day, rinse him off with fresh water. •


