

“Let’s Talk Fronts”

Why is it sooooo difficult to produce “good” fronts let alone the rarely seen “great” front in our breeding programs? ANYONE out there fill us in, will you? WHY should it be SO difficult? After all, there are only two bones in the shoulder of every breed of dog from a Terrier to a Mastiff!! Interesting how the size, shape, length, and angle of those two bones play a major role in determining how the dog looks when standing AND how it moves. For clarification, let’s identify some of the most frequently seen terms applying to the dog’s front or fore assembly. We see articles and read breed standards using various terms such as; Shoulder, Forehand Assembly, Shoulder Blade, Scapula, Upper Arm, and Humerus. All of these terms can and are used to describe structure of the dog’s “front”.



The long flat bone located at the “top” of the dog’s shoulder is known as the “shoulder blade” or “scapula”. The German Shepherd Breed Standard calls for length as well as lay back of the Shoulder Blade. Why? Because the *purpose* of our Breed requires the front assembly to be constructed in such a way as to permit the dog to move with an easy, out reaching and ground covering gait. A well laid back shoulder blade attached at the correct angle to an upper arm of similar length permits the German Shepherd Dog to gait in this desired fashion.

How do we go about determining the degree of shoulder angulation? Put your thumb and index finger of the right hand at the uppermost points of the shoulder blades and the same finger of the left hand where the shoulder blade meets the upper arm. Visualize a straight line extended to the ground in front of the dog. In most cases this line will mark the extent of the forward reach of the dog. A shoulder blade that is upright rather than laid back makes for a shorter neck and a longer back, which in turn throws off the dog’s balance. Interestingly, if a dog’s shoulder blade is short and upright it is USUALLY accompanied by a short upper arm – this incorrect structure prohibits the dog from achieving a ground covering gait. Given good lay and length of the shoulder blade and upper arm, we should also pay close attention to the ligaments, tendons, and muscles which hold the front assembly in place. Unlike the rear assembly – there are no balls and sockets holding the fore assembly together.

In a future article we will discuss the upper arm and its role in the ‘fore assembly’ of our dogs.

Over bites and Under bites

German Shepherd Dogs should have 42 teeth – 20 upper and 22 lower. The breed standard states that the teeth should be “strongly developed and meet in a scissors bite in which part of the inner surface of the upper incisors meet and engage part of the outer surface of the lower incisors. An overshot jaw or a level bite is undesirable. An undershot jaw is a *disqualifying fault*. Complete dentition is to be preferred. Any missing teeth other than first premolars is a *serious fault*.”

Another way to say this is that the perfect bite is a scissor bite where the incisor teeth from the top jaw are in contact with the incisor teeth from the bottom jaw but are positioned slightly in front, like two blades of a scissor if viewed from the side of your dog’s mouth. Any deviation from the traditional scissor bite is known as malocclusion in dogs.


What is an Overshot Bite? An overshot bite (brachygnathism) is where the upper jaw extends past the lower jaw, causing a gap between the incisors of the upper teeth and the incisors of the lower teeth. This prevents the teeth from each jaw from fitting as snugly as they would normally be.

What is an Undershot Bite? An undershot bite (prognathism) is where the dog will have their incisor from the bottom jaw protruding past the incisor teeth of the top jaw to give a “Bulldoggy” appearance.

What is a Level Bite? A Pincer or level bite is where the incisor teeth from the bottom jaw meet directly on top of the incisor teeth of the bottom jaw.

Will an Over Bite or Under Bite affect my dog? The vast majority of under bites and over bites will not affect the dog’s ability to eat or chew and dogs with either of these bites still make wonderful pets.

If an over bite is very severe, the dog may require some surgery, such as a tooth extraction if a tooth is growing into the opposite gum, but these instances are rare.



Can an Over Bite or Under Bite be corrected? Some specialized veterinarians can perform surgery to correct incorrect bites but this is normally done only in extreme cases, usually in smaller breeds, and for the vast majority of cases the mouth is left alone. Many puppies will go through stages where it seems that they are over or under shot as they grow but will often have the correct bite when they are adults.

AKC Breeders of Merit



Breeders of Merit are listed on the websites of the American Kennel Club, The German Shepherd Dog Club of America, and the German Shepherd Dog Club of Atlanta. The requirements to be an AKC (American Kennel Club) Breeder of Merit are as follows:

1. Must have a history of at least five years involvement with AKC events.
2. Must have earned AKC Conformation, Performance or Companion* event titles on a minimum of four dogs from AKC litters they bred/co-bred..
3. Must be a member of an AKC club.
4. Must certify that applicable health screens are performed on breeding stock as recommended by the Parent Club (OFA Hips/Elbows, GSDCA Temperament Test).
5. Must demonstrate a commitment to ensure 100% of puppies produced are AKC registered.

About the Club

Records are vague, but it seems that The German Shepherd Dog Club of Atlanta was founded in 1955 when a small group of breeders and owners interested in the German Shepherd Dog met in Atlanta, Georgia.



The first President was Mrs. Michelle Leathers Billings who passed away in October 2013. The purpose of the club was the improvement of the breed. Today, the club's goal is the same. Through programs and activities, members learn about all aspects of the German Shepherd Dog, including mental and physical development; the breed standard; working ability; breeding; care and rearing of puppies; etc...

Programs are presented at monthly meetings held on the second Thursday of month, except for July, October, and December. Meetings are at 8:00 PM. Both prospective members and non-members are

welcome. The club holds numerous special events including two breed Specialty shows each year and also Obedience and Rally competitions. Puppy matches, Temperament Testing and AKC Good Citizen tests are scheduled through the year.

In July, at the Annual Awards Banquet, trophies are presented to members whose dogs have earned titles over the year. A Holiday party is held in December. If there is an interest, show handling classes are offered to members.
