What is the GSDCA Red Book?

The Red Book has been published annually since its inception in 1971. The original intent was to showcase young sires and dams that showed promise of things to come via the Futurity/Maturity system.

Through the years, the Red Book has evolved into a publication that is more accurately referred to as "The Year in Review". ROM data was added in 1980, AKC Major Point Show data in 1994. Somewhere along the way the Red Book grew to include articles on breeding, veterinary and research topics; performance tabulations; dogs in service articles; working dog pages; and an interview. In this section, we strive to present breeders from all parts of the country who have excelled in our sport without necessarily being in the bright beam of the spotlight.

With the advent of the internet and google searches, the Red Book dropped most of the articles on breeding, veterinary care, and research. This information would likely be out of date in a printed book such as this. However, there is a wealth of information provided for any student of the breed. Not to mention, back issues allow the history of our GSDs to live, and we can see where the dogs of today have come from. That is why the Red Book is the #UltimateGSDResource!

So, what's in a typical Red Book? It begins with the Standard, then a review of the year's Award of Excellence winners, and National winners including Juniors. Then the top 20 Sires and Dams based on the year's Futurity/Maturity winners are showcased. Next is a section on the top 20 Sires and Dams based on progeny winning majors at AKC shows. Later in the book we find the top 20 Living Sires and Dams based on Register of Merit points. In this way, savvy breeders can identify top producers in the beginning of their careers (Futurity), those who have staying power (AKC Majors) and those who have fulfilled all their promise as producers and who also have longevity in their producing careers (ROM).

But the Red Book is not just for and about breeders. There is a robust performance section, where we show GSDs with Championships in multiple venues; Performance Champions, a page with photo for earners of the Performance Award of Merit (PAM), the National performance winners and Versatility competitors, the ATAA – Annual Training Achievement Awards – Dual Titled GSDs and rankings of the year's Obedience and Rally competitors. Following that is a section called The German Shepherd Dog in Service to Mankind, which contains any hero dog award winners and frequently an article about GSD Search and Rescue. The Red Book breeder interview wraps it all up. Usually, 300+ pages of GSD wonderfulness in pictures, pedigrees and write ups.

Where can you get one? The next issue of the Red Book for 2020 will be available for sale this fall around the time of the National. Hard copies in their signature Red covers of 2019 and 2018 are still available at the gsdca.org Store. There are also digital issues going back to 2008, so for a mere \$15 you can get a link to download a pdf file and take the Red Book everywhere you go with a phone, tablet, or computer. The more recent digital years are even in color!

News Flash!! A small stash of some early Red Books from the 1970s and early 1980s has been found and will soon be available at the gsdca.org Store! Anyone interested in the history of our great breed will want to have one – if not all of them. Stay tuned!

TRAVEL KIT FOR DOGS

I was recently approached by a club member asking what we have in our “emergency travel kit”. She suggested that we put a list together and share it in the newsletter. Great idea, right? Of course, it’s a great idea but more difficult than I expected. I began to reach out to my dog friends to get ideas so we can provide a thorough list of supplies that should be included in an emergency travel kit for our dogs. I must admit that some of the items suggested caught me by surprise. It started expecting to get a list of medical supplies but quickly turned into so much more.

One member suggested a ***CareCredit*** card should always be available. This credit card is accepted at almost any vet’s office. It is different than a typical credit card with various payment options. I have personally used it for a dog emergency that came with a hefty \$5,000 price tag. Even if your dog is insured, most vets want their payment up front.

Do you have a ***Bloat Kit***? I’ve heard people say that they don’t think they could do it. If it means saving your dog, you can and will use the bloat kit. These kits are available from several sources, but I would suggest you consider purchasing from Nature’s Pharmacy.

If you are traveling to a dog show, always refer to the premium list for the ***emergency vet on call*** for the shows. Either print the page and take it with you or take a picture of it with your phone. You can always delete the pic when you get back home.

We can’t talk about traveling with dogs without talking about ***crates***. There are SO many crates on the market that it is somewhat overwhelming. If you are on Facebook, I would suggest a group called ***Dog Sport Vehicle Ideas & Set-ups***. You can search on the year and make of your vehicle for ideas. People are great about posting pictures and answering questions. Do your homework and purchase the best crate within your budget.

We’ve all heard the horror stories about being involved in a vehicle accident while having our dogs with us. What happens to the dogs if you are injured? Emergency personnel will be caring for your dogs, but they also need critical information about the dogs. This would include emergency contact info, vaccination info, call name, picture of each dog, info on any medical issues, etc. Have you considered ***emergency information tubes***? These are available for purchase, or you can make your own.

Okay, now let’s talk about the medical stuff which was the original intent of this article. If you’re like me, you keep tons of dog stuff at your house and are prepared for most any dog emergency. However, we also need to plan for dog emergencies while traveling. Of course, the list is not all inclusive, but we will attempt to provide a list of the bare necessities. Please remember to replenish your supplies periodically and don’t forget to check expiration dates.

FIRST AID SUPPLIES

- BLOAT KIT - Please familiarize yourself with how to use the kit before an emergency
- ASCRIPTIN - For fever, **never** use Tylenol or Ibuprofen. (Normal is 99.5 to 102.5F)
- PEDIALYTE - For hydration
- MUZZLE - A good adjustable muzzle
- HYDROGEN PEROXIDE - For cuts, wounds, and poisonings
- BETADINE SOLUTION - (non-sting iodine) for wounds.
- SALINE SOLUTION - (used for contact lenses) for irrigating wounds
- NEOSPORIN OINTMENT - Antibiotic for burns and scraps
- KAOPECTATE - For diarrhea
- PEPCID - For nausea
- PHAZYME OR GAS-X - Simethicone for gas/bloat
- IMMODIUM - Also for diarrhea
- MILK OF MAGNESIA - For constipation
- THERMOMETER - Rectal
- BANDAGES - Telfa coated gauze pads (Curad), gauze roll (flexible), elastic tape

MISCELLANEOUS SUPPLIES

- Extra fresh water and bowls
- Several slip leads
- Extra dog food/bowls
- Cleaning supplies (paper towels, etc.)
- Poop bags/pooper scooper
- Blankets/towels
- Fans with extra batteries/charger (Ryobi fans are very popular)
- Electrical cords/tape
- Heavy duty scissors/knife
- Zip ties

Please keep in mind that these lists are not meant to be all inclusive. However, we urge you to put a great deal of thought into traveling with your dogs and keeping them safe and happy! You might have different ideas/preferences with the First Aid Supplies list. These lists are only suggestions that have been compiled from many friends in the dog world. You might also ask your handler what he/she carries while traveling with your dog and other client dogs.

Dog Sport Vehicle's Warm Weather Travel Checklist

This is in no way intended as an exhaustive list of ways to keep your pet cool while you travel, but it is a start, to get your creative juices flowing. Flip the sheet over and put your own ideas too.

While driving

- Battery operated fan to circulate the air, but not blow directly on the dog so as to prevent the dog from being able to get away from it. (you can use a lighter plug-in powered fan while you drive, battery when parked)
- Some form of air redirector, like a Noggle, to get the AC from the front of the vehicle to the back of the vehicle.
- Metal Mesh window covering, like Breezeguards (both for air flow and safety if the windows are down)
- Half ice half water in water bowls.
- Frozen food dispensing item, like a Westpaw Toppl. Only of course if your dog isn't headed to a competition and your practice is to delay meal time on those mornings.
- Cooling mat, like Zentekclothing.com offers. (Thermoregulation)
- Block the sun from coming into the vehicle onto the dog (like a small aluminet), as long as it does not obscure your line of vision
- Extra water in case you breakdown

Additional items for when the vehicle is parked

- Some form of silver shade, vehicle covering, like Aluminet (65% grade or greater), or Reflective Roof Tent
- Magnets or bungee cords to hold the shade cloth in place.
- Front window screen inside inserts, to deflect the sun. (available for front, front-sides, back-sides, and back window)
- Some form of hatch or door extender & lock, for airflow, like Ventlock.
- Cooling coat, if the dog is comfortable with wearing a coat (check their back – under the coat - often so that the dog doesn't get too cold, or if you use something like a shammy type coat, that it doesn't dry and the dog doesn't become too hot. Zentekclothing.com also offers a cooling wrap for dogs.
- Extra water in case you don't have access at your destination
- Sprayer attachment for a water bottle to spray your dog down before putting them back in the crate (if appropriate for your dog/breed)

Side note about interior temperature monitors and leaving the vehicle running with the AC on.... Technology and mechanical/electrical things can fail, and you do not want to substitute regular short interval checks on your pet's safety while in the vehicle alone.

German Shepherd Dog Club of America, Inc. Application for Membership

There are two types of membership. **Regular Members:** Minimum age of 18 years. Must be in good standing with AKC. Applicant (and renewing members) agrees to abide by the GSDCA by-laws and the Rules and Regulations of the American Kennel Club. Two endorsements by current members must be provided by new applicants. Applicant's name will be published in the *German Shepherd Dog Review*. Provided no objections have been filed within 30 days of publication in the *Review*, applicant will be notified that he/she is eligible for all privileges including the right to vote. **Junior Members:** Must be 10 years of age and not more than 18 years of age and shall subscribe to the same criteria as Regular Membership with the exception of the requirement to pay dues. Junior members cannot vote, hold office, or serve on committees other than junior committees.
